



Construction of a water main extension in the Borough of North Haledon to service Windmere, a Christian Health Community (formerly the Holland Christian Home) and additional homes along the extension were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The total project costs are estimated to be \$1,240,000. The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (Infrastructure Bank) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the Infrastructure Bank to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits by working collaboratively with the Holland Christian Home to extend a water main on Squaw Brook Road and Graham Avenue to service the Holland Christian Home and additional homes on Graham Avenue as a long-term solution to the PFAS contamination in their drinking water wells.
