## • **REVIEW OF MINUTES:**

#### • REPORTS AND DISCUSSION

#### CHAIRMAN

Victor D'Ambrosio spoke on the following:

He advised that the final punch list items are being prepared for the 2014 Water System Improvements project.

The Haledon DPW Foreman contacted him concerning the possibility of the MUA paying for an emergency stand-by employee of the DPW. The MUA currently pays for weekend time of the DPW employees working on the water system, which may not be necessary. Therefore, the expense of a stand-by employee may be a swap of the weekend time expense for budgetary purposes. This option will be looked into further by the Chairman and professionals.

The water connection installation of the Church located in North Haledon was delayed due to the fact that the pipe is galvanized so it needs to be changed to meet industry standards before the connection can be completed.

The annual water lien sale in North Haledon will be discussed in Executive Session.

He reminded the Commissioners to complete the annual Financial Disclosure Forms.

He thanked Commissioner Flach for her efforts in formulating the Summer Internship description and application. The position has a budget of \$2,000.00 and will further the MUA's operational goal towards better efficiency.

The new Passaic Valley Water Commission Agreement has been provided by counsel and is on for consideration.

The Passaic County Bond was renewed. Passaic County may require the MUA to provide a Traffic Control Plan; however, the final determination and direction on this issue has not been made.

The NJEIT advised that the MUA saved \$13,199.80 in total debt service repayments for its ratepayers. He thanked the professionals for their efforts.

The estimate for the cellular based metering pilot program was received. The total cost for software and meters is \$16,073.00 for the MUA's largest 1% ratepayers who purchase 15% of water sold. That total is thirty-two (32) accounts. This cost obviously does not include the installation. The total budget for the pilot program is estimated at approximately \$25,000.00. Commissioner Flach explained the pilot program in detail. The cellular system provided more reliable and efficient information. From the information of the pilot program, the MUA can formulate a long range meter upgrade strategy. The Engineer also answered questions concerning the program. Several questions were raised that will need to be responded to by the software company. Therefore, action on the program will be held pending receipt of the additional information.

## ENGINEER

Justin Mahon submitted report, which is on file and he spoke on the following:

He discussed the 2014 Water System Improvement project issues.

He advised that the County's requirement for a Traffic Control Plan has been resolved as to the connection at 361 Squaw Brook Road.

The County is requiring that the plan be customized by road.

The Complaint received from 31 Terrace was discussed. The Engineer will follow-up and report back at the next meeting.

Casey Cordes submitted report, which is on file and addressed any questions.

# AUDITOR

Chuck Ferraioli spoke on the following: The 2016 Audit is being finalized. Revenues have increased by \$40,000.00 when compared to this time last year.

# LICENSED OPERATOR

Greg Cardena submitted report, which is on file and he discussed the following:

PVWC performed an emergent repair on a leak in the chemical feed system located at Burhans Avenue. A DPW employee collects samples at the site for analysis by PVWC. The Licensed Operator will supplement this effort by conducting independent analysis on a weekly basis. Quotes are still being received for the necessary repair at the Central Avenue Tank.

The inspection and testing of the Lead and Copper sample pool sites has been quite slow. Only 11 customers have scheduled appointments from the 90 that were initially contacted. Depending upon the response next month, additional steps may need to be taken in order to expedite the process.
