



Construction of upgrades and improvements to the Heights Tank located in the Borough of Haledon were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The total project costs are estimated to be \$650,000. The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (Infrastructure Bank) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the Infrastructure Bank to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits by improving water age and minimizing the formation of disinfection by-products in the tank for residents and businesses served by the Heights Tank in the system's 515 Service Area.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
